David M. Glasgow is a Pennsylvania-based pianist, vocalist, composer, actor, and educator.



A “by-ear” pianist since he was old enough to reach the keyboard, David began private piano technique and theory instruction at age 6, and by age 8 was accompanying his elementary-school chorus and writing his own songs.

At his high-school commencement ceremony, he and two other vocal soloists performed a piece he had composed for the occasion, backed by the school choir and accompanied by piano and solo flute.

David received a Bachelor of Arts (cum laude) in Music Composition & Theory from Dickinson College, where he was also honored with both the Emil R. and Tamar Weiss Prize in the Creative Arts and the Gould Memorial Drama Prize. His graduate work in theology earned him a Master of Divinity from Lancaster Theological Seminary, where several of his original choral compositions were debuted.

In 2005 he returned to his alma mater to serve on the Music faculty at Dickinson, where he taught piano, accompanied vocal ensembles, coached voice students, and served as Musical Director for musical theatre productions until 2013.

A Credentialed Music Leader in the Unitarian Universalist Association and an active member of the UU Musicians Network, David has served the UUA as General Assembly Music Coordinator, and has been a regular presenter at Worship Arts Festivals and youth “CONS” of the UUA's Joseph Priestley District and Central East Regional Group. Locally, David is privileged to serve as Music Director for the Unitarian Universalists of the Cumberland Valley in Boiling Springs, PA.

David also enjoys frequent collaborations (as accompanist, musical director, composer, and performer) with the educational and performance programs at Open Stage of Harrisburg, and since 2014 serves as Music Director for the spring musicals at Harrisburg's Capital Area School for the Arts.

David and his husband Mark have been together since 1995, and share a home in Pennsylvania with their four feline “kids”: Tobias, Sophia, Stewart, and Jake.

Elisabeth Stimpert is a founding member of the critically-acclaimed new-music ensemble Alarm Will Sound (www.alarmwillsound.com). She has performed across the country and internationally at major venues in New York, Philadelphia, Cleveland, Los Angeles, San Francisco, Los Angeles, Denver, Moscow, St. Petersburg, Amsterdam, Seoul, and Germany. Elisabeth works regularly with many of today's leading and emerging composers, having presented world premieres of works by John Adams, David Lang, John Luther Adams, Wolfgang Rihm, Michael Gordon, Augusta Read Thomas, Stefan Freund, Robert Pound, John Orfe, David E. Chávez, Daniel Kellogg, and many others. Also a dedicated collegiate music educator, Elisabeth serves as Contributing Faculty in clarinet, chamber music, and music theory at Dickinson College, where she also performs with the Dickinson Faculty Wind Quintet, and maintains a private lesson studio for clarinet students of all levels in Carlisle and Cumberland County, PA.

Allen Roth started playing bass in high school and went on to major in music at Lebanon Valley College. After college he started a widely varied music career, in which he toured extensively in much of the U.S., Europe and Puerto Rico. As a member of the band "Shucks," he scored a #1 song on the national independent record chart with the song, "I Love to Dance," and he has played for Bob Hope, Phyllis Diller, Robert Goulet, Frankie Avalon, Bobby Rydell, the Platters, the Smothers Brothers, the Lennon Sisters, and the Osmond Brothers. He also appeared with Sally Struthers in the show "Always, Patsy Cline." Allen is retired from public school teaching. He was a band director in the Carlisle Area School District for 27 years.

Dani Fiore is an accomplished percussionist, guitarist, and songwriter who hails from the Asbury Park area of New Jersey. She has performed on such stages as the legendary Stone Pony in Asbury Park and the Starland Ballroom in Sayreville, NJ, and how performs and records regularly as the percussionist for the original alt-folk group, Indian Summer Jars. A favorite contributor to the music program at UUCV, Dani also enjoys collaborating on concerts and theatrical events at Open Stage of Harrisburg, the Capital Area School for the Arts, and elsewhere, as well as facilitating drum circles, teaching, and bringing people together with the connective power of group hand drumming. In 2015 she created the "Life in Rhythm" program to benefit ALL people regardless of musical ability.

June 10-26 • Open Stage of Harrisburg


